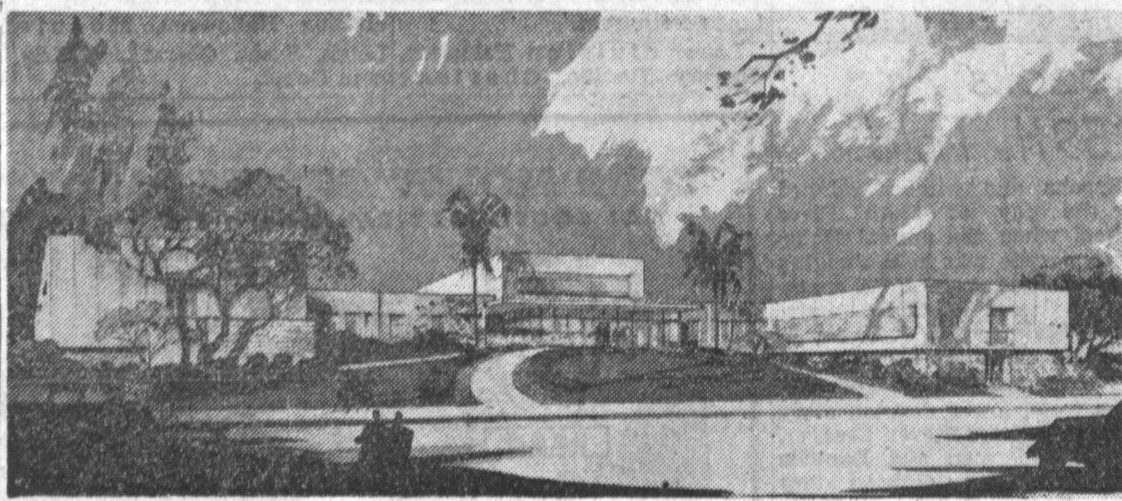

HOSPITAL FUND-RAISING CAMPAIGN OPENS TODAY

Henry W. Creeger, general chairman of the Torrance Memorial Hospital \$300,000 Building Fund Campaign, announced the plans to build a modern and enlarged Torrance Memorial Hospital to meet the growing demands of the people of this area.

Chairman Creeger, General manager of American Radiator and Standard Sanitary Corporation, called attention to Torrance's present deplorable lack of a safe balance of available hospital facilities in announcing the opening of the campaign.

"The Torrance area has experienced such a tremendous growth that the people of this district are now facing an acute shortage of hospital beds in which to care for their sick and injured," he said.

Serious Emergency
"The Building Fund Campaign has been planned and organized because the hospital situation in the Torrance area has

developed into a serious emergency," Creeger said. "It must be remedied at once. This can be done only by the joint efforts of thinking, far-sighted citizens. The success of this campaign will depend upon the whole-hearted cooperation of all of us."

A complete and separate maternity wing with 20 new beds for mothers, three labor rooms, two delivery rooms, two large nurseries, and full obstetrical facilities will be a major feature of the improved hospital. Bed capacity will be increased by one-half to a total of 93 beds. Two major operating rooms, a minor operating room and a fracture treatment room, plus complete surgery facilities will be built in the rear center wing. Fred W. Mill, division controller and assistant secretary of National Supply Corporation, and Donald Armstrong, attorney, are co-chairmen of the campaign. Both emphasized the need for correction of the present deplorable shortages of the hospital.

Funds

The hospital construction program will be carried out by the \$300,000 of the fund campaign goal and about \$200,000 in Federal funds which have been granted.

Donald Findley, secretary of the Torrance Memorial Hospital board of directors said that the board expects construction of the new additions and facilities will begin shortly after the first of the year.

A nationally prominent hospital architect, Merrill W. Baird, has drawn the plans for the new construction.

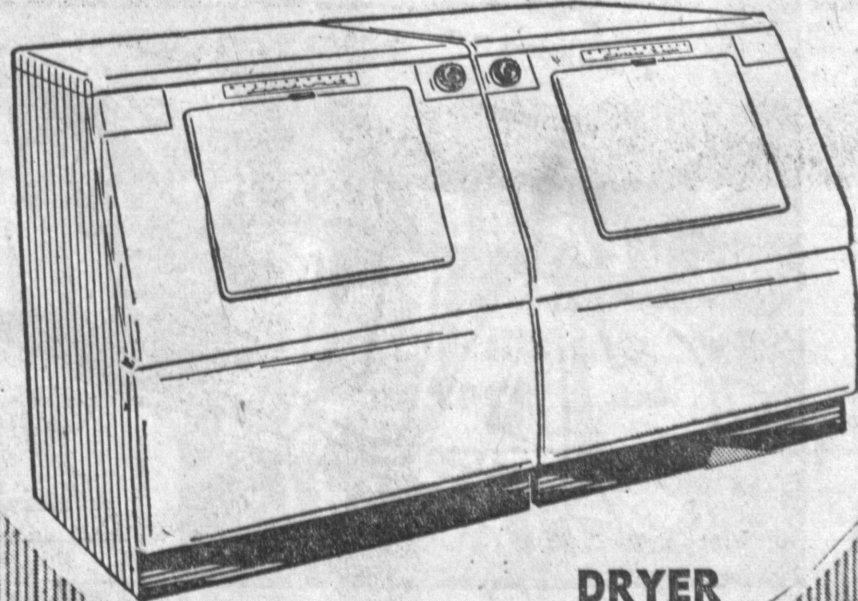
