ing from the production and refining of petroleum and the distribution of petroleum products up to the service station.

Hydrocarbon emissions from these sources amount to 207 tons per day.

It is claimed, however, that refineries contribute only a small percentage of the hydrocarbon emission. The breakdown is as follows: controllable petroleum industry operation, 13.9% while service for 3.6% and automotive equipment for 82.5% of the hydrocarbon emissions, according to a study made by the Stanford Research Institute.

Day stated that the petroleum

industry reduced its emissions by 35 per cent from November 1953 to October 1954. He maintained that refinery operations account for only 140 tons per day or 9.4 per cent of the total emissions.

Steps Taken

Three major steps have been taken to overcome air pollution.

1) Evaporation from gasoline tanks is being controlled through floating roofs or vapor recovery systems. About 99 per cent of the tanks are now in compliance with the county regulation. Deadline for full compliance is May 1955. Reduction of hydrocarbon losses is estimated at 56 tons per day.

2) Separators and sewers. A program is under way for the

covering of all separators in which oil is recovered from waste water. The effects will be to reduce losses from 40 tons per day in 1953 to 10 tons per day in May 1955.

3) Truck loading in the loading of gasoline trucks. The method has already been described.

Water Vapor Not Smog
An attempt was made to clarify a common misunderstanding concerning the water vapor which is often seen in connection with refinery operations.

"Unfortunately, the steam rising from cooling towers and from the exhaust of steam-driven pumps has been erroneously referred to as 'smog,'" Day said, "and the public often confuses this with smog. Actually this wa-
