Drive Approved

at which time Styles tried to help Finch find a publisher for his songs.

Finch, who is 39 years old and weighs 97 pounds, says he has been writing music the last 15 years. He has never had any musical training and writes lyrics and music without the use of an accompanying instrument.

The local man has written novelty, western, and religious music.

Becomes ill
Finch, his wife, Roma, and their six children, came to California in 1943. He worked for North American but became ill, suffering a nervous breakdown. He is still not able to work, Finch states, and hopes that his music will soon provide him with a permanent career.

"Creation without accomplishment, that's what's discouraging," Finch said. "In the past I've always created for the sake of creating. But now it's necessary to assure health and make a living. I can't get music out of my system — I just have to compose. But when I finally gain recognition I want it to be on merit only."
