Following an amused burst of laughter in which Judge Willett joined, the judge explained that what is meant is that she need not answer questions for which she might be prosecuted later.

Mrs. Groh No. 2 did not avail herself once of this privilege during the questioning, however.

Except for smiling slightly during this episode, the second wife did not betray her emotions, keeping whatever strain she felt well under control.
