State JayCee President Addresses Local Chapter

Phil Knox, 32, president of the California State Junior Chamber of Commerce, gave an inspiring address here last week when he spoke on the purpose of JayCee at the "Bosses Night" dinner meeting of the Torrance Jaycees.

"Young men of America today should be and are vitally interested in the America of tomorrow. . . . We want it to be the same kind of America as was given to us," Knox said in explaining the purpose of the organization.

Two-Fold Program
He spoke of a two-fold program necessary for putting the group's ideals into effect, namely, serving the community through civic activities, and training of young men so they will be more capable in fulfilling their obligations to themselves, their families, their employers, and their community.

Knox cited examples of several JayCee members who have made valuable contributions to the organization, and humanity.

"We talk of these men for the same reason that we have rulers or measuring sticks in our offices," Knox concluded. "We are always being measured and these men give us the standards by which to measure ourselves."

Knox, an Oakland attorney, heads the state organization which has 153 chapters totaling 10,000 members between the ages and 21 and 35 years.

Also presenting a few words of greeting was Dick Fitzgerald, national director.






