Building Up 62% Over '53

Building activity in Torrance has already surpassed predictions and when the year is up the figure will stand somewhere between \$44-million and \$45-million, an increase of more than 60 per cent over last year's figure, according to City Building Department sources.

Construction for the month of November sky-rocketed to \$4,789,591 as compared with last year's November figure of \$1,920,722, according to Walter Bradford, senior clerk in the Building Department. Total through November for this year now stands at \$41,477,049. Last year's total for that period stood at \$26,280,030.

Continue To Rise
Building activities in the coming year will continue to raise by leaps and bounds, Building Superintendent John Russell predicted, stating that it would probably reach the \$70-million mark.

CRENSHAW: Crenshaw boulevard between Carson street and Sepulveda boulevard, will be improved under a bid call slated for December 21 by the City Council, according to City Engineer Ronald Bishop.

LOMITA BOULEVARD: Authorization for the payment of \$8,811.00 for the purchase of eight parcels of land, necessary for the widening of Lomita boulevard was given Tuesday by County Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

Chace said the parcels to be purchased will provide part of the right of way for the county's program to widen Lomita boulevard from Western avenue to Woodward avenue.

The county's program, Chace announced, calls for the widening of the traffic artery, which now varies in widths from 40 to 60 feet, to an 84-foot wide, four-lane highway.

WALNUT STREET: Appropriation of funds for the grading and paving of the shoulders of the road on Walnut street to a point 600 feet south of Lomita boulevard to provide for adequate drainage into the recently constructed Lomita storm drain was approved Tuesday by County Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

Chace said the appropriation will permit the County Road Department to begin work immediately "to allow for the proper drainage prior to winter rains."

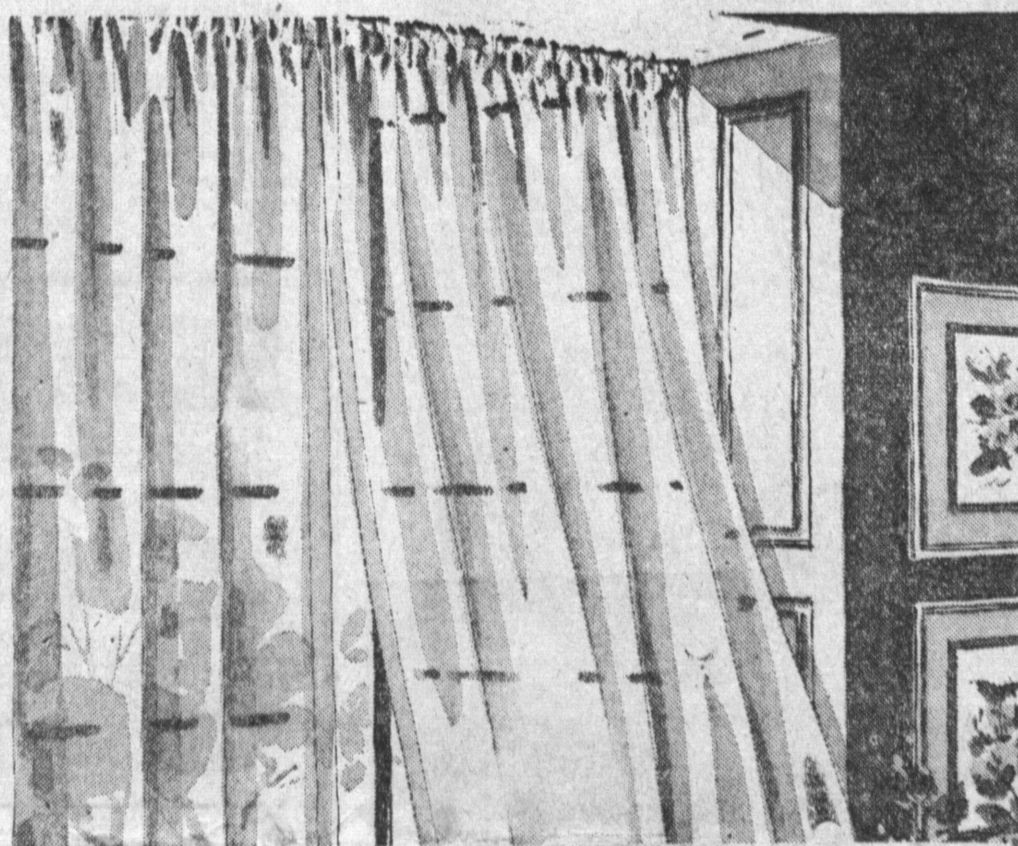

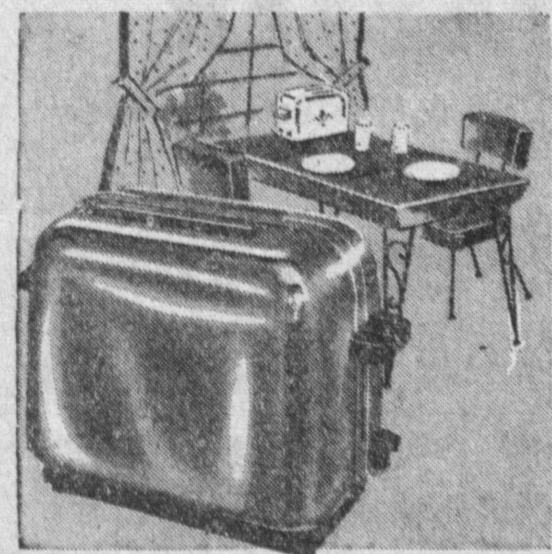
