## JEWELRY OFFERS WIDE SELECTION FOR GIFTS

The Christmas shopping season is on... the stores and streets are bedecked with gay holiday decorations, and now while it is still early, is the time to find the best buys and the largest selections.

### Jewelry for Gifts

For a wide price range the jewelry and cosmetic counters offer gifts from the tiniest price on up to three figures. The jewelry displays, however, are more tempting than ever this year. Color is played up more than ever before to tie in with the whole new colorful look of fashion.

Since the return of the "Chanel look," miles and miles of colorful ropes of beads are becoming ever more popular. These are particularly versatile, as they may be lengthened or shortened according to costume and the whim of the wearer. They may also be wound around the wrist for a chunky bracelet effect.

You can't go wrong on a good-looking bulky bracelet, or a grouping of the narrow gay-colored circles. With so many pushup sleeves, and styles that leave the lower arm and wrist exposed, bracelets are a "must" for so many of us whose wrists may be on the bony side.

Earrings present another gift possibility that will make a hit. Cascades, pendants, giant buttons, and huge discs of catalin, beads, simulated stones, pearls and gold and silver metal, will add bulk above the neckline to balance wide shoulder lines.

**How To Select Right Style**

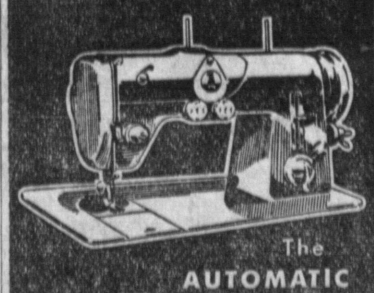

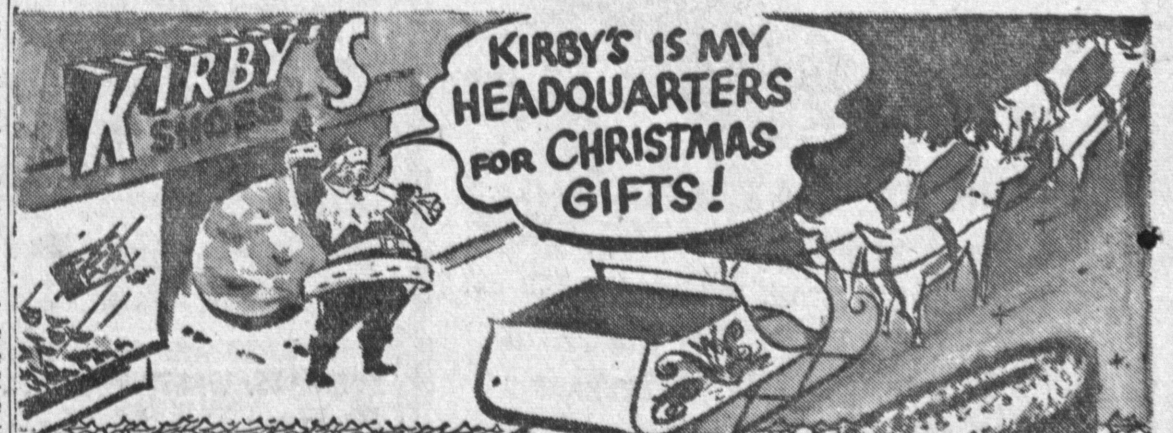
