Serra Loses Heartbreaker To Barstow

Playing before a Homecoming crowd of nearly 3000 people, Serra was nosed out of a victory by the Desert League Champs from Barstow, 14-12. Scoring first blood, the Riffians had their opponents buffaloed with the brilliant running of Fullback Toy Owens, who scored on a 21-yard blast over left tackle. They again shot over from the 6-yard line in the second quarter, while Halfback Jim Mullens of the Cavaliers slashed from the eight.

Bouncing back in the second half, the Serra Cavaliers monopolized the ball, having a touchdown pass from quarterback Don Qienke to end Jerry Long called back. The Cavaliers, with their great display of defense and offense, held their foes to almost no gain in the second half.

Led by Captain Jim Cowden, the Serra forward wall was held up by Dewey Gansemer, Jerry Uribe, Mike Reagan, and Jerry Stadler on defense. On offense, these Seniors tore gaping holes in the Barstow Riffians line, for scat backs such as Mullens and McCarger to scoot thru.

After being set up by a flanker pass to fullback Gary Norton, Ziemks blasted over right tackle for eleven yards and a Serra's final tally. With less than two minutes to play in the game, the Cavaliers started a desperation drive. Beginning on their own 40 yard line, Serra marched down to the Riffians 39, where Don Ziemke threw a final pass as the gun went off. Skip Anderson took the ball from two Barstow men and went as far as the one yard line, just missing the winning touchdown.

The Sealions ran up a 33-12 score on the Walteria Wildcats, to a four win and no loss record in the Midget League, and the Seals barely eked out a 12-6 win over the previously undefeated Walteria Bruins to maintain their three win no loss record, in the Junior division.

Junior Games

In other Junior games, North Torrance Rams won their first game in four tries, with a 12-6 win over Nativity, and the Demons topped the Hornets, 19-12, to go into a two way tie with the Bruins for second place.

One other Midget game was played, Nativity defeating McMaster Park's Cadets, 32-20. The Seals vs. Hornets game, rained out at Walteria on November 11, has been rescheduled and will be played at 7 p.m., at McMaster Park on Thursday, December 2, as a preliminary to the Bruin-Demons game.

Saturday, November 20, a full slate of previously rained out Pee Wee games was played. At McMaster's Park the Bees beat the Panthers 20-0, and the Trojans edged the Preps 13-12.

Record

At Walteria, the Walteria Mudhens set a high scoring record for the season in sinking the Walruses, 67-0, in the first game. The Walteria Eagles notched a 31-6 win over El Retiro in the second contest.

In Monday's Pee Wee games at Walteria, the Mudhens, in beating their brother playground team the Eagles by a 36-13 score, became the only undefeated team in the league.

The Trojans slid into second place by means of a 25-19 win over the improving Walruses team. At McMaster's, the Preps bested the Panthers, 32-0, and the Bees stung El Retiro, 49-0.

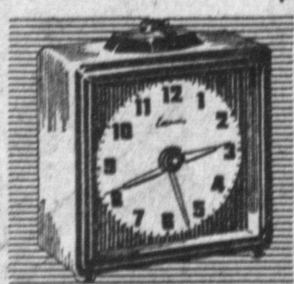
