Gifts are exchanged only on the children's Christmas which is observed on January 6, the feast of "Los Santos Reyes," or the Epiphany, which comemmorates the three kings who brought gifts to the manger at Bethlehem.

Statues Imported The three principal statues, those of the Christ-child, Mary, Joseph, were brought to Mrs. Atencio early this year by a friend from Mexico. They are hand-carved by natives of the small village of Leon Juanajato, the only place in Mexico where religious statues of this type are made. The three figures cost \$40, or 490 pesos.
