MARINELAND ANNOUNCES NEW FEEDING SCHEDULE

A new feeding schedule was instituted by Marineland of the Pacific this month to provide the public with five porpoise jumping shows and underwater feedings during the daylight hours, it was announced by Ray W. Smith, vice-president and general manager.

Since the Oceanarium hours are governed by the sun, the final feeding show is now at 4 p.m. Opening at 10 a.m. Marineland has shows at 11 a.m., 1 p.m., 2 p.m., 3 p.m. and 4 p.m.

Danger
The earlier final feeding was necessitated by the danger which the divers must face in feeding the wild sea animals in semi-darkness. Night preying eels, which hide during the day under the rocks, come out under the cover of darkness to hunt for food. The Marineland divers have been attacked several times by the dreaded Morays and have narrowly escaped serious injury.

Newest arrivals at the world's largest dry land ocean, located on the Palos Verdes peninsula, are three sea-going sun fish, technically called Mola Mola.

The placid creatures, which feed on small particles of animal life found in the sea, have been recorded in size up to one ton. They flap helplessly about the surface and their only de-

fense is a tough, elephant-like hide.

Over 200,000 Visitors
During its first three and one-half months of operation, the Oceanarium has had over 200,000 spectators viewing the fish and several thousand more in the children under six years of age who are admitted free of charge.

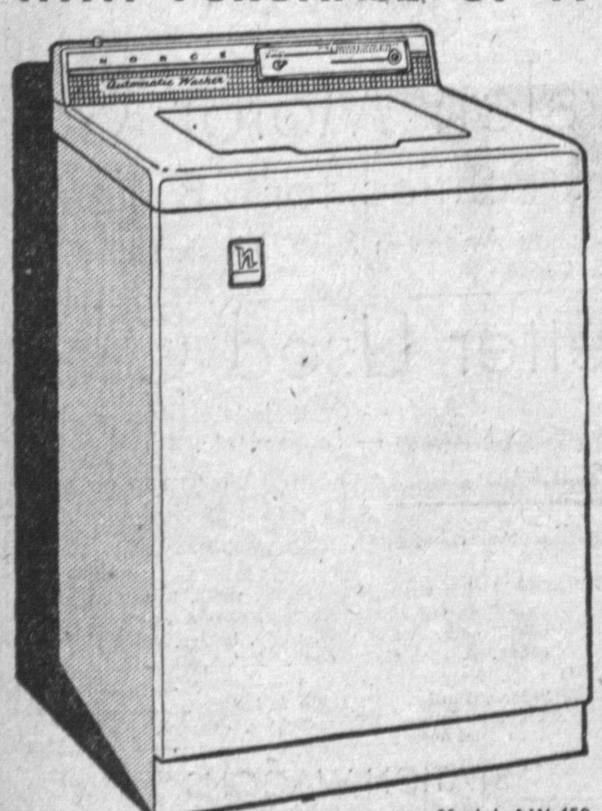

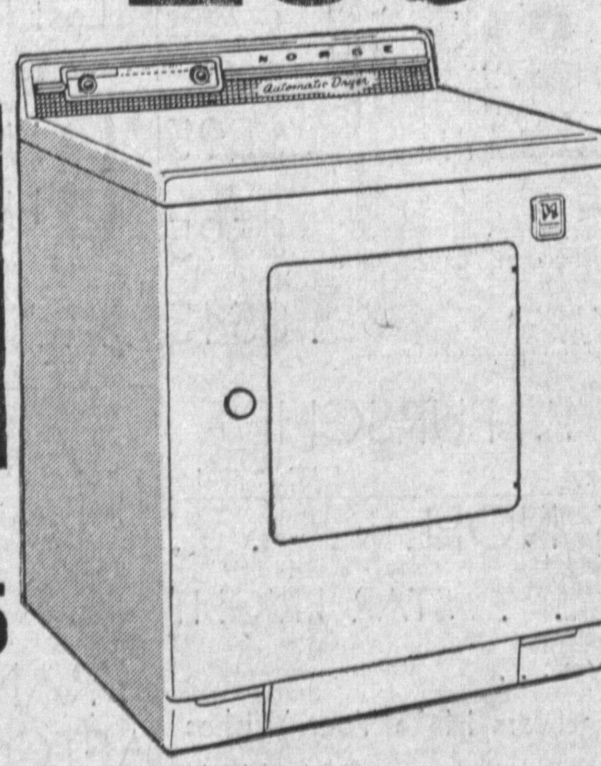
