

No Money For Signals But Let's Be Friends

The desire to maintain good public relations between the city and the school district triumphed at the recent Board of Education meeting when members decided to meet with the city in order to discuss the purchase of school traffic signals.

However, that's as far as the Board would go in the matter, it appeared.

While the City Council asked for the meeting in order to get the School Board's OK on a joint financing of school traffic signals, the School Board indicated quite firmly that they would never agree to such a proposal.

They hoped that by agreeing to such a meeting they would be able to convince the Council that the School Board just doesn't have the money for such a program. They also want to point out to the Council that traffic signals lie within the jurisdiction of the city and that the school's responsibilities are strictly educational.

The Board further felt that it was best to have representatives from the Council and School Board meet on the matter rather than all the members of both bodies for purposes of efficiency and diplomacy.

A letter will be addressed to Mayor Nick Drake agreeing to such a meeting.

Safety Factors

Police Chief Willard H. Haslam attributed the otherwise low accident rate to the fact that motorists were more traffic-conscious as a result of the timely "SD-Day" experiment.

The fact that industries were closed Friday, eliminating the great number of "office parties," was a significant factor in keeping the accident rate down to a minimum, Haslam conjectured.

Friday accidents included one at Crenshaw and 229th street, involving a car driven by Michael P. Habaush, 17, of 2055 West 250th street, Lomita, and another automobile driven by George Cain, 43, of San Pedro.

While Officer Buck Ingram investigated this crash, another accident occurred at the same location involving a car driven by Mike P. Duarte, 33, of 1752 West 254th street, Lomita, and a second car driven by Vincent P. Lechner, 41, of 2441 West 254th street, Lomita.

Officer Ingram handled this call as well.

Another collision occurred Christmas Eve at 174th street and Amie, involving autos driven by Pantel G. Chalekson, 64, of Redondo Beach, and Leonard D. Kane, 42, of Chalekson was turning left onto Amie from 174th street.

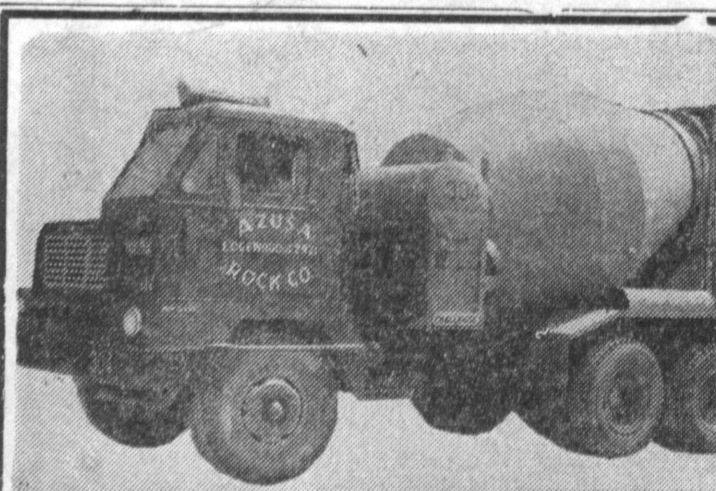

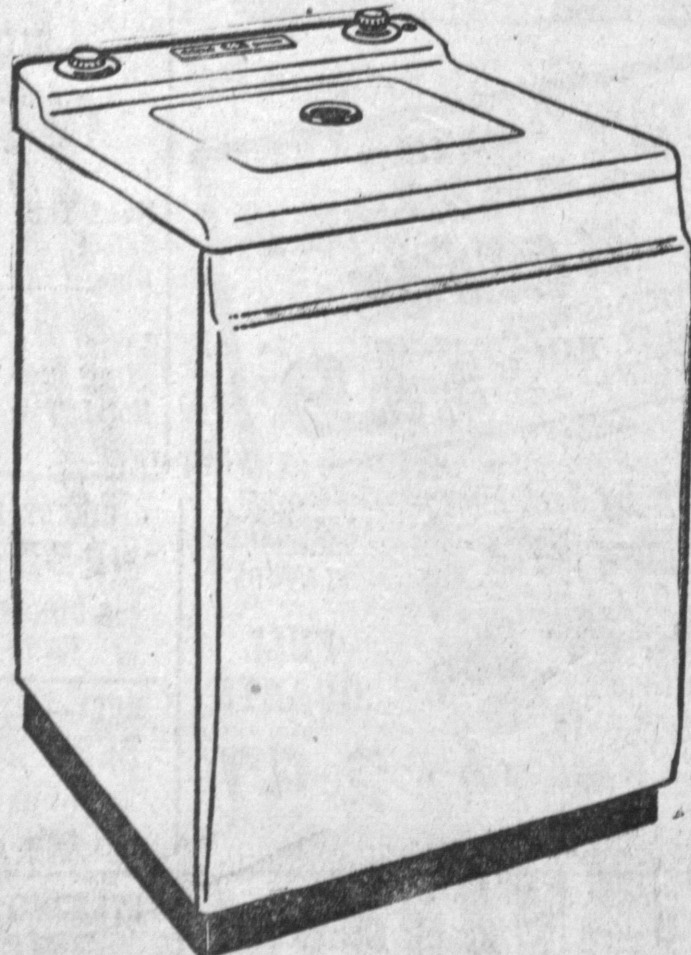
