

## **Aliens to File** Address Report

Every alien who is in the United States during the month of January 1955 must make an address report, it was announced this week by the Naturalization Service of the United States Department of Justice.

Aliens can obtain the form from any post office where t' vy should ask for an Annual Address Report Card, Form I-53 between now and Januar 31.

The card is to be filled out, signed, and returned to a clerk in any post office or immigration office. Cards are not to be mailed.

This address report is an annual requirement and is not to be confused with alien registra-
