**New Homes** Historic Milestone

The new community, Southwood Homes, developed for veterans, by the Kauffman-Wilson building organization at Hawthorne and Sepulveda, marks another milestone in Southern California history.

The property, recently pur-chased from the Del Amo Estate company, is out of the hands of the original land grant family for the first time since the grant from the king of Spain in 1784.

The marriage of the late Suzanna Dominguez, descendant of Juan Dominguez, who obtained the grant, to Dr. Gregorio Del Amo brought about the transfer from the Dominguez estate to the Del Amo estate.

The purchasers of the Kauffman-Wilson homes will therefore be the second families to settle on this land.

1900 Homes Approximately 1900 homes

will be built at Southwood Homes, according to Lee Halison, sales manager. Those now under construction have three bedrooms, two baths and twocar garages. Twenty-five different elevations are offered, based on eight floor plans.
