he then proceeded to drive in a run by smashing a solid single into right field.

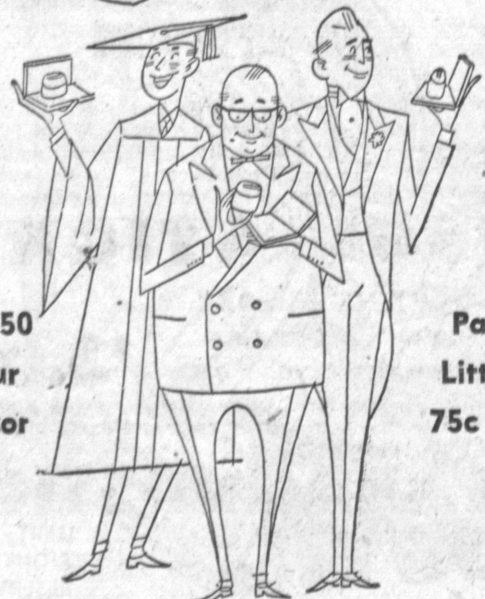

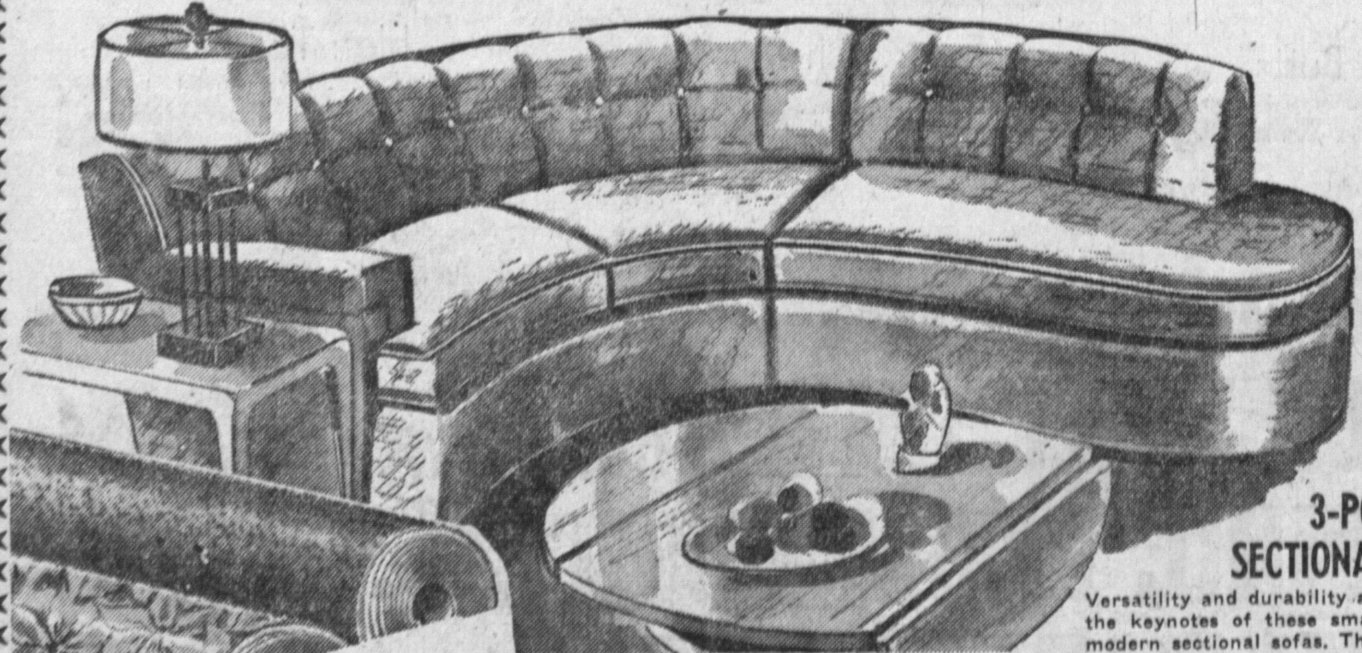
