



Dear Mrs. Sandridge: Our lasagna recipe hasn't been in the column up to this time, but in answer to your request and many others here

Anthony's Baked Lasagna Sauce:

quart Anthony's Spaghetti Sauce (or your own homemade sauce)

pound chopped beef 1/2 pound chopped pork Mix beef and pork. Fried in Olive Oil.

Cheese: 2 pounds Ricotta cheese seasoned with several sprigs of chopped parsley, salt, pepper, grated cheese and one egg. Mix thoroughly.

pound grated Italian cheese (Parmesan or Romano) 1/2 pound thin sliced Mozzarella cheese

Lasagne: pound wide Lasagne noodles. Boil 6 quarts water with 3 table-

spoons salt. Place Lasagne in boiling water one at a time. Boil for 15 minutes and rinse in cold water and drain.

Place a thin layer of sauce in bottom of baking dish, then a layer of Lasagne to cover bottom. Spread a layer of Ricotta about 1/2 inch thick on top of Lasagne. Sprinkle a layer of meat next, then a layer of sauce and sprinkle with grated cheese. Start again and repeat for sevral layers, ending with agne. Top this with a layer of sliced Mozzarella cheese and a final layer of sauce. Bake in 250 degree oven for 20 minutes. Serves 10 large dinner portions. Big secret: We think a Las-

agne is better if baked the day before you plan to serve it. Just add a little sauce and reheat Well, there you are, Mrs. Sandridge. Please let us know how it turns out. We'd really like to hear from any of our


