EDITORIAL

Three Torrance Councilmen killed the rabies law by voting 'NO' Tuesday night. They are Councilmen Nickolas O. Drale, Willys G. Blount, and Mervin Schwab.

This is a matter of record to be remembered by Torrance voters at election time.

By their action these three Councilmen have shown that they have more faith in the forces of hysteria, distortion and irrationality than in the forces of reason and logic based on the irrefutable testimony of experts and authorities.

Their action serves as a bland affirmation that they would sooner go to a witch doctor than to a physician.

Only two men had the strength and the courage of their convictions. They were Mayor Albert Isen and Councilman Victor E. Benstead who clearly and forcefully declared themselves in favor of the rables law.

We are glad that the Council at least saw fit to let the people decide on the matter at the general election this coming April when the rabies issue will be placed on the ballot.

We feel that the people will give the three cautious councilmen the answer they were afraid to express.

In the meantime, the cases of animal rabies, human Pasteur treatments, and potential tragedy which may occur will rest squarely on the conscience of Councilmen Blount, Drale and Schwab. That is what they chose.
