Zone Plan For Rolling **Hills OKed**

A minimum of 7000 square feet per lot will be required under a master zoning plan for approximately 6000 acres of land in Rolling Hills. The zoning plan was approved by the C unty Regional Planning Commission this week after 18 months of haggling and compromise.

Annexation

The land in question was, late last year, offered to the City of Torrance for annexation by the principle owners of the property, the Great Lakes Carbon Corporation. The annexation plan fell through when the company backed off under pressure from residents of adjacent Rolling Hills.

A spokesman for the Regional Planning Commission said lot sizes will vary from 7000 to 20,000 square feet minimum and a limited amount of highly restricted commercial area was included. Quarry

Also a quarry zone was granted to Great Lakes Carbon to operate its diatomaceous earth mine at Crest road and Crenshaw boulevard.

A highly restricted commercenter was allowed for near the mine site.

In other action, the planning commission approved a change of zone allowing. 20,000 square foot lots in specific isolated areas near the boundaries of the Rolling Hills Community association. The areas formerly were zoned for lots of at least one acre.

IGNORE STATE ON SLOUGH

City and county officials have decided to go ahead with development of Bixby Slough into a regional park without state aid, it was announced Tuesday by the office of Councilman John Gibson.

The announcement indicated that the local officials have tired of prolonged waiting for the State Wildlife Conservation Board to act on a request for a \$100,000 contribution to the park development fund.

The city and county already have allotted \$300,000 for acquisition of slough land now in private ownership. A third is budgeted this year and the remainder already has been ap propriated from budgets of the past two fiscal years.
