

Lomita Shooting Gallery Wine Bottle Wife Beater Proprietor Kills Patron by fining Fined, Jailed In Front

A 73-year-old shooting gallery proprietor killed a 28-year-old patron by firing five bullets into him, three of which pieced the man's heart, lung and skull.

Arrested on suspicion of murder was Oscar Nelson Shogren, 73, of 254301/9 Narbonne ave., Lomita. Shogren claimed self-defense in the shooting of Glen E. Walters of Hayward, Calif.
