With yards in Wilmington, Long Beach and San ager is appointed by the City Manager Stevens declared, with Pedro, the firm supplies over a million feet of lumber to builders of the area each year.

> When founded in 1923 by I. J. Rossman, E. J. Rossman and Frode Kilstofte, the firm had an inventory of \$10,000 and employed four men at the Wilmington site. Today the company has an inventory of over \$1 million, and does an annual business in excess of \$7 million.

> Both of the Rossmans have retired from the business. In 1946 Frank R. Hill joined Kilstofte in the ownership and management of the corporation. They head a staff of over 150

Kilstofte, who is active in many civic affairs including membership on the executive boards of both the Community Chest and the YMCA, points out that firm is a complete supplier of the building trade and of "Sunday builders."
