From July 1954 to June of 1955, a great variety of recreaational activities was offered youngsters of Torrance by. the Recreation Department.

The total attendance or units of service during this period was 27.957.

During that period, twelve recreation programs were carried on during the summer months, in addition to the yearround program and the adult hter program.

The areas on which afterschool and part-time programs were carried on during the winter months included El Retiro, McMaster, and Walteria parks, Civic Auditorium, Torrance high school, Perry, Evelyn Carr, Fern Freenwood, Walteria and Seaide schools.

Outstanding events of the year included: boys' softball leagues, adult and boys' basketball leagues, special Halloween, Christmas, and Easter programs, baby show, kite contest, Yo Yo contest, and many other special events of city-wide interest

During the Christmas and Easter vacation periods, fulltime programs were carried on at the areas listed above. The past year was the first year in which a fully organized program was added to the recreation program. During 1953, after-school programs were set up at Perry and Seaside Schools and Mc-Master and Walteria parks.
