Storm Drain Bid Awarded To Rados

truct the Cabrillo avenue storm drain and a short portion of the 212th street drain in Torrance was submitted by Steve P. Rados, of Monrovia, Supervisor Burton W. Chace said

Bids were received at the office of H. E. Hedger, chief engineer of the Los Angeles County Flood Control District. Award of contract is scheduled by the Board at the regular meeting next Tuesday and the contractor will be allowed 330 days in which to complete construction; Chace said.

The project will be financed by funds from the \$179,000,000 storm drain bond issue approved by county voters in November, 1952. Designed by Torrance City Engineer Ronald W. Bishop, the project will provide trunk line storm drain to remove surface storm waters from streets in the east Torrance residential and industrial district.

When completed, the flood control project will be nearly three miles in length and will consist of four main lines. Line A will be constructed in Torrance boulevard from Western avenue to Cabrillo avenue, in Cabrillo to 220th street, in 220th to Arlington avenue, in Arlington to 222nd, and in 222nd to Plaza del Amo, Chace said.

Line B will run from the junction with Line A at Torrance and Llewellyn, in Torrance to Border avenue, in Border to Dominguez street, and in Dominguez to Crenshaw boulevard. Line C will be installed in Torrance from Border to Engracia avenue, and Line D in Carson avenue from Gramercy avenue to iLne A in Cabrillo. A total of nine bids were submitted with the high bid reaching \$874,773, Chace added.


