#### Ebbinghouse Appointed

4-lbs Rabbit

POULTRY

1/3 Cup Barbecue Sauce

(Your own or bottled) 1/2 cup water

Wrap rabbit pieces in damp cloth place in shallow baking dish hollow side up—brush generously with barbecue sauce, pour water in bottom of pan—cover and bake at 350 degrees—one to one and a half hours. Remove, cover, turn pieces and brush tops generously with sauce. Bake uncovered 30 minutes or until brown. Basting with sauce to keep surface moist. Serve fixed!
