 present more than 13,000,000, and that the school shortage has thus grown to its present proportions.
 (It was declared by Governor Knight at the Sacramento educators' conference September 30 and October 1 that California is now short 10,000 classrooms.)
 Figures quoted by Governor Knight at the Sacramento conference were cited at the meeting of fathers, showing that

spending for schools in the state was only 2% per cent of the overall individual annual income, whereas in 1938, according to the Governor, it was 3% per cent. It was recalled that the Governor had announced that California's annual income was now \$25,000,000,000 — the highest in all history.

Bigger Planning Needed
 The fathers declared in a unanimous resolution for presentation to the P-TA that planning in the sweeping school crisis simply was not big enough, that vision, enterprise, broader mea-

ures, and even emergency action would be needed to correct it before the education of many thousand of youngsters now on half-day sessions would be permanently impaired.
 Bond issue of insufficient size, delay in spending available funds, and delay in obtaining Federal assistance for schools all came in for their share of the blame for overcrowded schools, half-day sessions, and a shortage of teachers.
 Immediate emergency measures to provide full-day sessions for all pupils were demanded

by the fathers. They agreed that temporary housing would make it possible, as it has in other communities.
 A letter from the School Board in reply to the P-TA resolution was presented, which stated in part: "We should be thankful for what we have."
 This, the fathers agreed, was a negative approach to the problem. The letter failed to give any reason for the lack of broad scale planning considered adequately by the fathers, and this, they declare, is the crux of the crisis.

Encourage Growth
 Touching on the westward migration of millions of people

from other parts of the country the fathers agreed, contrary to the opinion of most school authorities, that this is a good thing for California.
 "The Board admits that this is the fastest growing area in the world," it was stated, "the board concedes the development is the greatest in history. If our fair state, and the Southland in particular, has so many attractions that people insist on coming here, then we must raise our sights considerably in planning. We like the idea of growth and development; we hope the greatness of Los Angeles County shall know no bounds. Let us therefore, not blame the eager people coming into our midst from other states. These people are now contributing to the fabulous wealth of California."

 annexed the territory but the Redondo school district refused to assume responsibilities over the area, leaving it in the Torrance school district.
FLATTERING
 The petition was labeled "very flattering" by Cromwell Warner, Jr., Redondo school board member. He said, however, that the area would create a heavy burden on Redondo which is trying to end double sessions.
 Torrance is also burdened by double sessions and school officials said that Redondo's double sessions only affect classes up to the third grade while in Torrance they go up to the fourth and fifth grades.
 If the Board of Supervisors decides that the area should be included in the Redondo district, the change would not become effective until September 1956.
 The area lies east of Inglewood Ave. between 182nd and 190th Streets, and west of the railroad right-of-way.



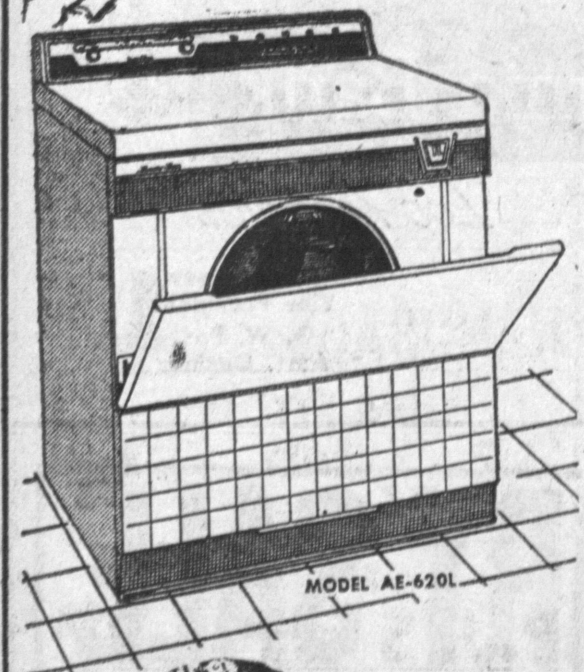
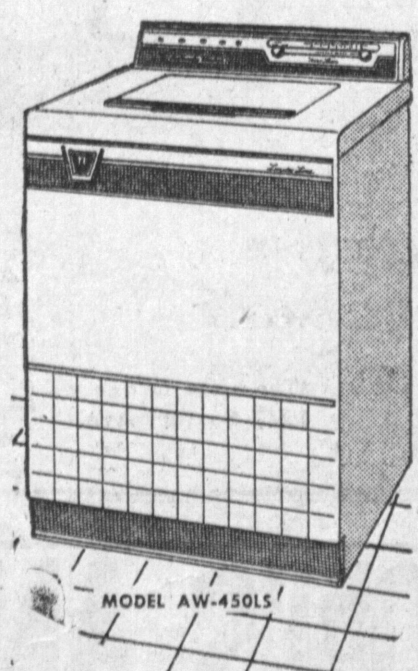

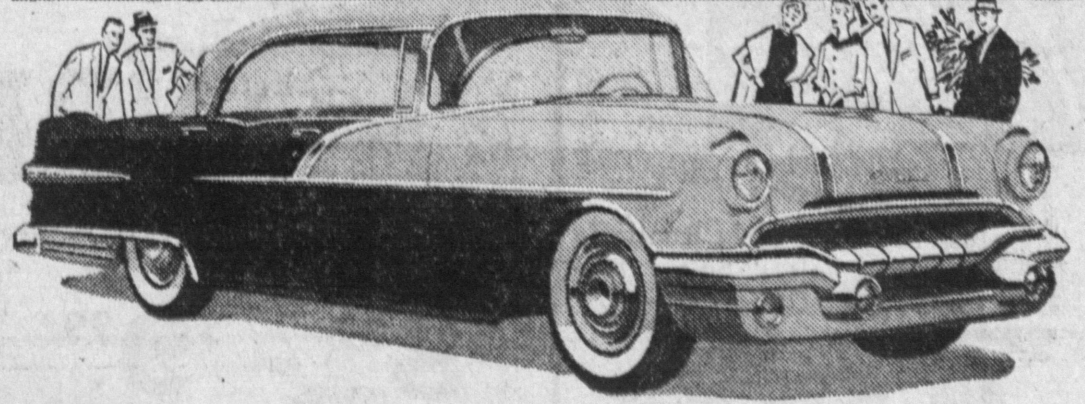
