This means that the 6000 dogs must have their antirabies inoculation certificates as of today or else their owners may be cited for violation of the law.

Two public clinics have been held in the past two weeks at which time dog owners could have their dogs inoculated for \$2. One more such clinic will be held tonight, Thursday, November 17, from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. at Torrance park, located at Arlington ave. and Santa Fe ave. (near Sepulveda blvd.) Dogs must be on a leash.

No arrangements for any further clinics have been made but it is possible that another one may be held, officials

So far only 650 of the 6000 licensed dogs have been inoculated during the two publie clinics.

If a person's dog is picked up now by the South Bay Hu-mane Society, the individual must first pay for an inoculation before the dog will be released from the pound.

Any dog owner found violating the rabies law may receive a \$500 fine or six months in jail or both.

Decrepit dogs, upon certificate from a veterinarian, or dogs under six months of age, may be exempt from the shots. The rabies vaccinations are good for two years. They prevent dogs from contracting the fatal disease and from infecting human beings.


