Protests Proposed Dump Site

MORE Members of the Organization voted unanimously against the conversion of this pit for a dump. Reasons cited were:

**IIIIII** 1. Heavy traffic through this residential area would be extremely dangerous and unsightly

2. Heavy dump trucks would of necessity, travel streets over which youngsters in this area must traverse in going to and from the elementary schools. It is a known fact that youngsters are unpredictable in their actions and it is feared that in opening such a site in addition to other objectionable reasons for same, would result in possible injury or fatality among the children.


3. It is proposed that a million dollar shopping center be MONEY built in the vicinity of Crenshaw Boulevard and Pacific Coast Highway. Initiation of a dump certainly would not enhance the view of such a shopping center.

4. For over 30 years residents in this area have been fighting to discontinue operations of the diatomaceous earth mine. Residents have spent much time, effort and money in trying to build this area into beautiful countryside homes, and it is felt the condition and elements surrounding a dump would definitely cause property values to decrease immeasurably.

In view of the objections raised against the conversion from a mine to a dumping operation, the resident of this vicinity and members of this organization strongly object to the initiation of a dump on the site of this property and therefore, we urge your members to reconsider their plans and withdraw any recommendation they have made for using this pit for a dump. 
