Methodists to Attend Long Beach Rally

Members of the First Methodist church of Torrance will attend a mass evangelistic rally at Long Beach on Sunday, February 19, to hear Bishop Gerald Kennedy, who for two weeks is preaching in one-night stands over Southern California and Arizona to start the first phase of united denominational effort in the area known as "The March of Faith."

Buses will leave Torrance First Methodist church, El Prado and Manuel avenues, Sunday evening at 6:30 p.m. for the Long Beach church, where the rally begins at 7:30 p.m.

The local congregation, led by Rev. John L. Taylor, has selected Long Beach as the rallying point most convenient to hear the bishop's call to join in placing the evangelism emphasis in every department of the parish program.

A recent announcement from the national headquarters Board of Evangelism reveals that there are 69,000,000 persons in the United States with no church affiliation.

Laymen already have been meeting for visitation evangelism.

Said Hubert Orton of Hollywood, who is conference lay leader for the whole territory, "Our idea is that if you want to contact the unchurched, a good time to go after them is Sunday morning. That's when you'll catch them at home."
