on the subject, rather than trying to summarize the varied opinions expressed that evening.

First and foremost, he said, we are not reaching the people who need guidance. We are completely out of touch

He proposed a realistic counseling and training program such as is used in Palo Alto.

There, youngsters and their parents are given an alternative when they get into trouble—either a jail sentence and fine or attending a training class.

He also called for more militant action against drinking which is the source of much anti-social behavior.

Thirdly, he called juvenile delinquency only a "cold sore," and pleaded that we get to "the fever that's causing it—the human heart." "If youngsters don't respect us," he exclaimed, "we

probably don't merit respect." He called a number of reasons mentioned as the cause of juvenile delinquency that night "contributing factors"

and a number of solutions good but not basic. "Youngsters must be helped to develop moral fibre," he asserted. "Activities are not enough. Hitler 'activitied' the German youth to death. We're doing by carelessness what Hitler, Stalin, and Moussolini did by law-they weakened the home and church and moulded the child."
