

James Hall maintains, is that the court rested its decision on another Supreme Court ruling (Peters vs. Hobby) which does not apply in this case.

According to that case, the body involved had the power to reduce or eliminate the punishment but not to increase it.

However, Hall said, that body did not have legal powers whereas the City Council has been given legal powers by the city charter.

The other error involves the court's concept that the city manager was the head of the building department and not Dresser.

"We intend to show what the charter shows - namely, what his duties consist of and the fact that he is in a managerial position over all the heads of the departments," Hall said.

Hall said that the petition for rehearing will be filed short ly. If it is denied, the city will know in about 30 days whether the State Supreme Court will hear the case or not. It will then take about four months to obtain a decision.


