Civilians Given Army Certificates

GAS LINE EXTENSION COMPLETED

Major extension of natural gas pipelines to service the entire Palos Verdes peninsula was completed this week, according to Southern California Gas Company's Division Manager E. F. Hawkesworth.

The aquarium tanks and both the restaurant and hotel at Marineland of the Pacific are among the 130 new customers receiving gas service.

Extension of the line south from Lunada Bay area started 50,000 feet of main serving the area through Abalone Cove, last November, and involves Palos Verdes, and Portuguese Bend.

"The entire area is growing rapidly," Hawkesworth said. "We expect eventually to serve a new community of 60,000 to 70,000 population on the Palos Verdes peninsula."

Dave Ackley, managing editor of the San Bernardino

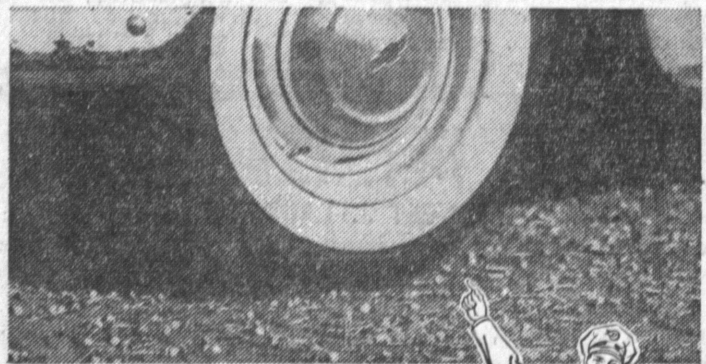
Sun-Telegram, spoke to the
