UNIFORM ZONING STUDIED

For approximately one year the Regional Planning Commission has been devoting staff time to a study of the various zoning ordinances in the incorporated communities of Los Angeles county in order to achieve uniform zoning designations and descriptions for all zones within both the county and incorporated cities of Los Angeles.

Breakdowns of various zone classifications in the cities as well as the county have been made and land uses for these zones established.

It is now anticipated that the county and the Los Angeles County Division of the League of California Cities will work together in an attempt to gain adoption of the uniform symbols.

According to Regional Planning Commission Chairman Robert S. Groman, adoption of the uniform zoning will be up to each of the cities which will still be able to control its own zoning pattern.

However, as a zone is adopted by any city, it will have the same symbol as a comparable zone in any other city in the county and thus enable the layman to understand the zoning problem in so far as all communities in the county are concerned.
