## ATTEND THE CHURCH OF YOUR FAITH

Before Christ spoke these words He said: "Take no thought saying, What shall we eat? or, What shall we drink? or, Wherewithall shall we be clothed? For after all these things do the Gentiles seek." We know Christ did not mean that such things had no place,

because He himself gave them a place. How-ever, He did teach that they should not have the FIRST place, for He said, "Seek first the Kingdom of God, and His righteousness." The question is that of preferment.

There are some who give God no place at all in their lives. They live for the things which are seen only with the natural eye and neglect the most important things, which are things eternal. "Things which are seen are temporal; but the things which are not seen are, eternal." (II Corinthians 4:18). They lay up treasures on earth, forgetting to lay up treasures in Heaven. They love the present world. God is entirely forgotten and neglected. Christ has no place in their lives.

There are some who give God a place, but a very small place. They relegate Christ and Christianity to some small recess of the heart.

If one is coming to Christ he should come NOW, He should make Christ FIRST, salvation FIRST, preparation for Heaven FIRST. The brevity and uncertainty of life proves this time and time again. There is danger of missing Christ, salvation and Heaven by neglect. God says: "Today is the day of salvation."

Because of these and many other exhortations given by our Lord in His Holy Word, the local church is endeavoring to "hold forth the Word of life" in the community. The church in the community is a bulwark against all the evil forces which are so prevalent today. We are all aware of the evil of Communism in our land, and we are told by the authorities of today that "the church is the best defense against Communism." The purpose of Communism is to destroy our homes (especially homes where Christ is honored), then undermine our
