"During the current hearings 1344 El Prado before the Congressional Ways and Means Committee on Public Assistance I have heard witnesses testify as to the inadequacy of the part the federal government plays in this program which effects the lives and welfare of over five mil-

ion needy Americans. "In my district, and I think most Congressmen have the same situation, many recipients of this aid have brought their problems to my attention. I find that the majority of these complaints are caused by the pitifully low amount of aid payments and very strict local administration of the "means

"The average amount these unfortunate citizens receive each month is hardly more than that given to the unemployed on "work relief" during the de pression, 26 years ago. Considering the purchasing power of the dollar today, as compared to depression years, gives ne a vivid idea of the struggle hese assistance recipients are making to live.

"While improvements and revisions have been made by Congress in the Old Age and Survivors Insurance Benefits, the Public Assistance Section Narbonne & Pacific Coast Highway has been almost wholly neglect ed. This has caused the states to impose more and more restrictions with the net result that the laws of no two states are alike. Only congressional action can straighten this out.

"I believe that the features of my bill, introduced as H.R. 10736, will go a long way to ward easing this situation.

"After 20 years of function ing, the Social Security Act and all its features can no longer be considered as an experiment. The time has come when congress must enact laws to assure uniformity of administration of the Public Assistance Section throughout all the states, and establish a humane standard of need, below which no state shall 24303 Narbonne be allowed to go and still receive federal grants-in-aid.

"Congress must act to see that public assistance is administered promptly and humanely with due regard for the preservation of family life and without discrimination because of sex, religion or political af-


