## El Camino College's Recreational Facilities to be Open to Public

"Recreational facilities of El Camino College will be made available to residents of neighboring communities throughout a large part of the summer," Forrest G. Murdock, president of the college, announced today in releasing an outline of the projected program.

Provision of facilities for use of the public is in accord with the community educational program conducted by El Camino, the college president explained. It is the goal of the administration of the college to make a maximum use of facilities provided to the community which has been largely instrumental in providing them, he added.

To make recreational facilities available to the maximum number of persons, such areas as the softball fields, gymnasium, archery range, running track, tennis courts, volley ball courts, and pools will be opened for an 11-week period throughout the summer. The program will be supervised by college physical education instructors, assisted by student recreational leaders.

### POOL SCHEDULE

Pools will be in operation from 8 a.m. until 10 p.m. Monday through Friday, while other facilities will be utilized from 9 a.m. until 4 p.m. Monday through Saturday, it was announced. "The entire program is being planned and developed by the college and is available to all people in the community on an equal basis," Merl F. Sloan, director of student personnel, explained.

"In following this plan to its democratic conclusion, we cannot reserve the pools for any group," he added.

In administering the operation, the college will divide the summer into five instructional periods, each of two-week duration. This ten-week period will be followed in the eleventh week by a water carnival for all children participating in the instructional program.

Sign-ups for the first two-week program will occur in the Campus Center from 8 a.m. until 12 noon on June 16. Registration dates for subsequent instructional periods will be June 30, July 14, July 28, and August 12, Sloan announced.

The charge for the two-week instructional program will be nominal.

The daily schedule for use of pools has been outlined as follows. All instruction will be educational.

### Pool Schedule: Monday through Friday:

8 a.m. to 9 a.m., instruction, 10, 11, and 12 year olds; 9 a.m. to 10 a.m., instruction, 10, 11, and 12 year olds; 10 a.m. to 11 a.m., instruction, 7, 8, and 9 year olds; 11 a.m. to 12 N., instruction, 7, 8, and 9 year olds; 1 p.m. to 2 p.m., instruction, 13 through 17 years, inclusive; 2 p.m. to 3 p.m., recreational, minimum age—7 years; 3 p.m. to 4 p.m., instruction, 13 through 17 years, inclusive; 4 p.m. to 5 p.m., recreational, minimum age—7 years; 6 p.m. to 7 p.m., instruction, adults, 18 years and

over; 7p.m. to 8 p.m., family hour, adults, 18 years and over, children under 18 years accompanied by parents; 8 p.m. to 9 p.m., instruction, adults, 18 years and over; 9 p.m. to 10 p.m., recreational, adults, 18 years and over.

All swimmers must furnish own suits and towels.

The family hour, like recreational hours, will require no sign-up, and is provided primarily for parents and children and adults of 18 years and over with instructional privileges to aid the children in learning to swim. The charge for this service will be identical to that for recreational swimming, and no minimum age for children will be established.

Summarizing the philosophy behind the new summer program, President Murdock said, "Our goals to make these new available to as many in the community as possible. We feel that it is the responsibility of the college to teach people to swim or to swim better, rather than merely to offer a purely recreational program."

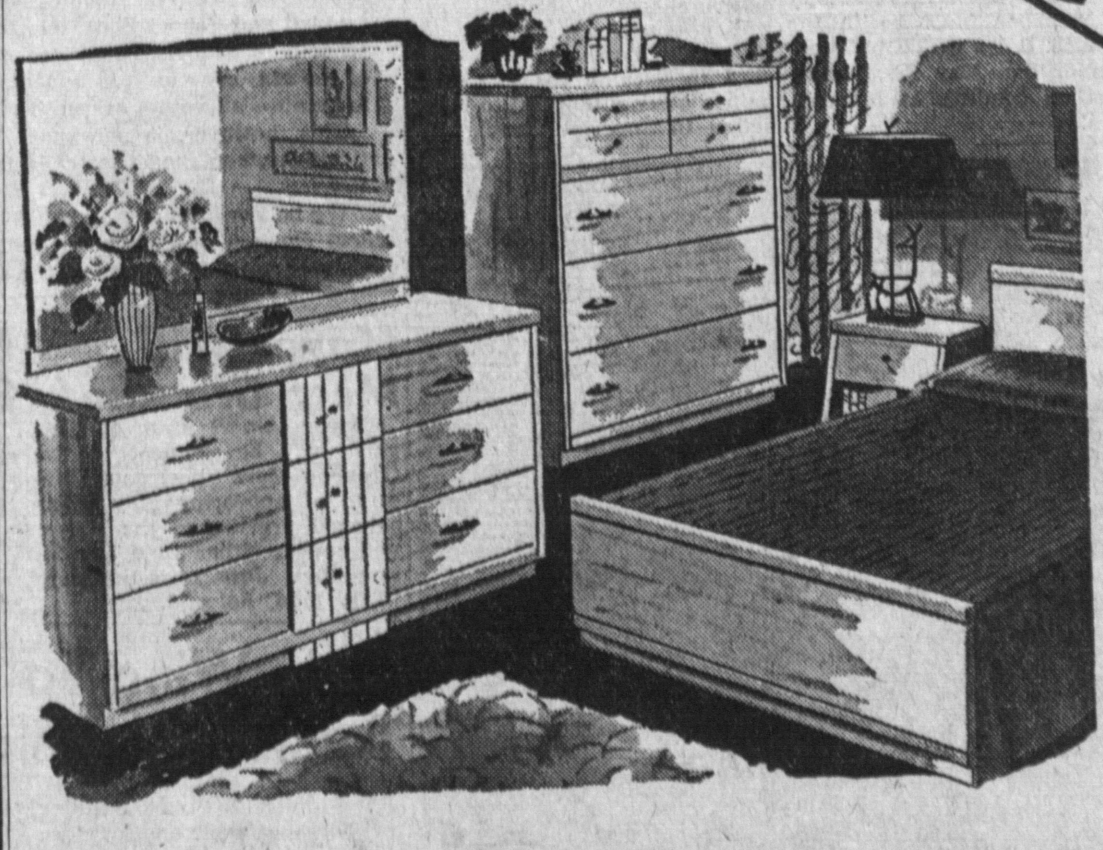
