

Narbonne Graduation Scheduled

A record number of students will be graduated from 112 schools in the Los Angeles School System in commencement exercises slated for the week of June 11, it was announced this week by Superintendent of Schools Claude L. Reeves.

A total of 33,823 pupils will make up the 1956 summer graduating class. This represents an increase of 2381 over last year's total of 31,442 pupils, Reeves said.

Details of the City Schools' summer graduates were presented to the Board of Education last week (May 24) by Superintendent Reeves. The report told of graduation ceremonies in 43 junior high schools, 37 senior high schools, 25 adult schools, and seven junior colleges.

A total of 315 Narbonne junior high school students will

graduate June 13 at 2:30 p.m. in the auditorium. There are 168 boys and 147 girls.

A total of 180 Narbonne high school students will graduate June 15 at 5 p.m. Commencement exercises will be held on the playing field. The 180 students break down into 82 boys and 98 girls.

There will be student speakers for the junior high school graduation. Dr. William H. Davernport, chairman of the USC English department, will speak at the high school graduation.

PLATE DENTURES IMMEDIATELY AFTER EXTRATION

Question—
"What is an immediate denture?" asks Mrs. L. R. of Harbor City.

Answer—
An immediate denture is one where the remaining natural teeth are removed and the denture is placed directly in the mouth, so the patient does not have to go without teeth.

Usually the front teeth are left. Then when the denture is ready, these are extracted and the denture inserted.

As the gums heal, the denture will gradually loosen up and sore spots may develop as the denture continues to settle. If the denture becomes too loose, your dentist may recommend some form of adhesive to help you until the gums are completely healed.

The denture can then be refitted, or in cases where the change is so great that the bite has changed, the dentures may have to be remade.

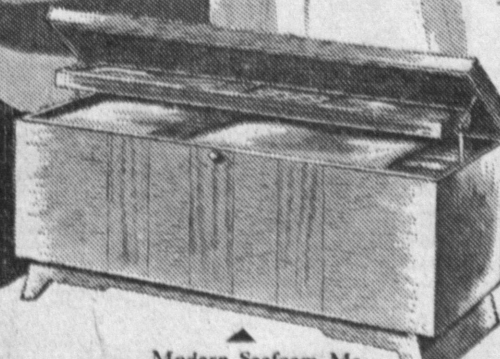

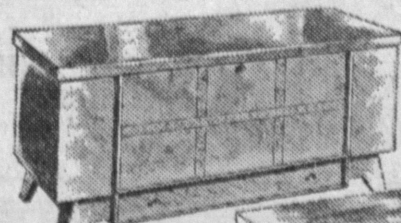

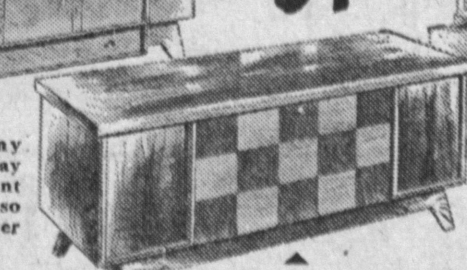


Pearl Mahogany chest. Self-lifting tray inside — convenient drawer in base. Also available in lighter finishes. No. 6172-11 \$74.95

EC Summer Registration Scheduled

Registration for the El Camino College summer session will be held in the Campus Center June 29, Merl F. Sloan, director of student personnel announced today.

Hours for class sign-ups will be 1 to 4:30 p.m. and 5:30 to 9 p.m., he stated. The summer program will run from July 2 to August 10 with 109 classes being offered. Programs offering the names of courses, hours, and instructors are available in the registration office in the college administration building.

Commenting upon the summer program, Sloan said, "The summer session appeals to high school graduates, college students, and adults who wish to progress toward junior college graduation, prepare for upper division university work, ready themselves for employment, or provide personal enjoyment."

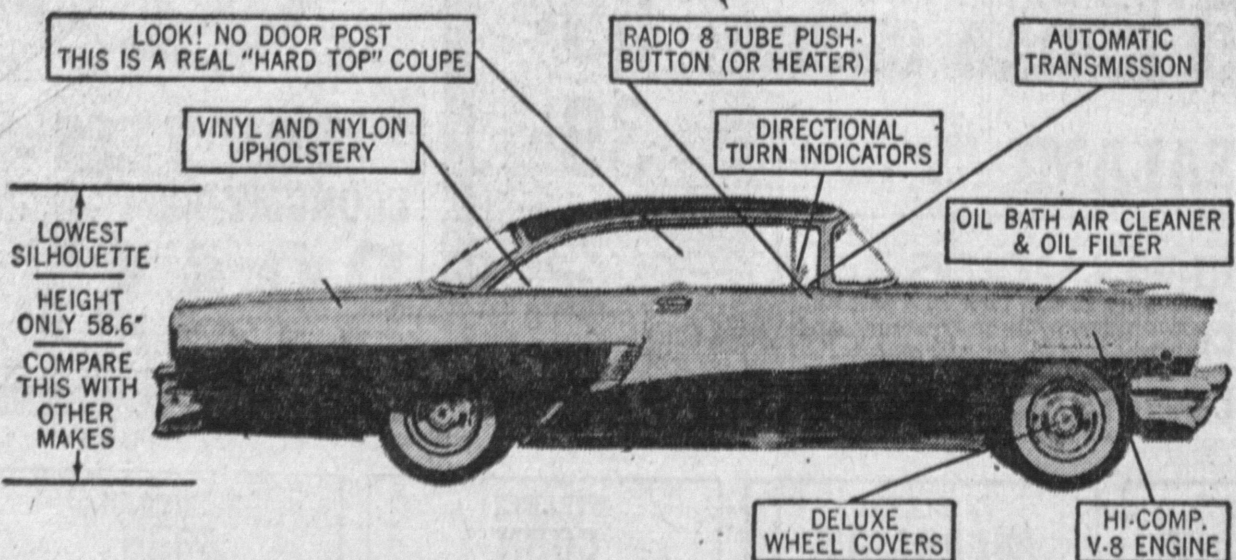
