Mrs. Funk, community youth chairman, reported on the organization sponsored by the school.

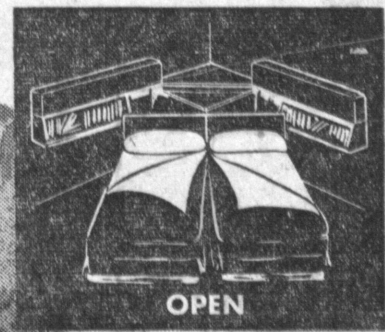

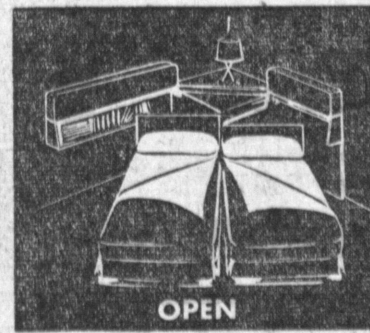
