All this week the Women of the Moose have been active in supporting the Sister Kenny Drive.

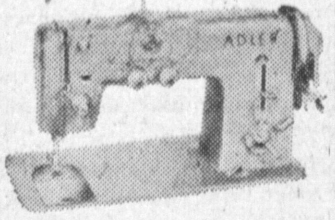
Women of the Moose are helping the Loyal Order of Moose selling tickets for the Torrance Community Fair.

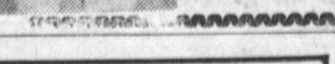

To be eligible for kindergarten next year a child must be five years of age by December 2, 1956 or four years and nine months by September 1, 1956, it was announced.

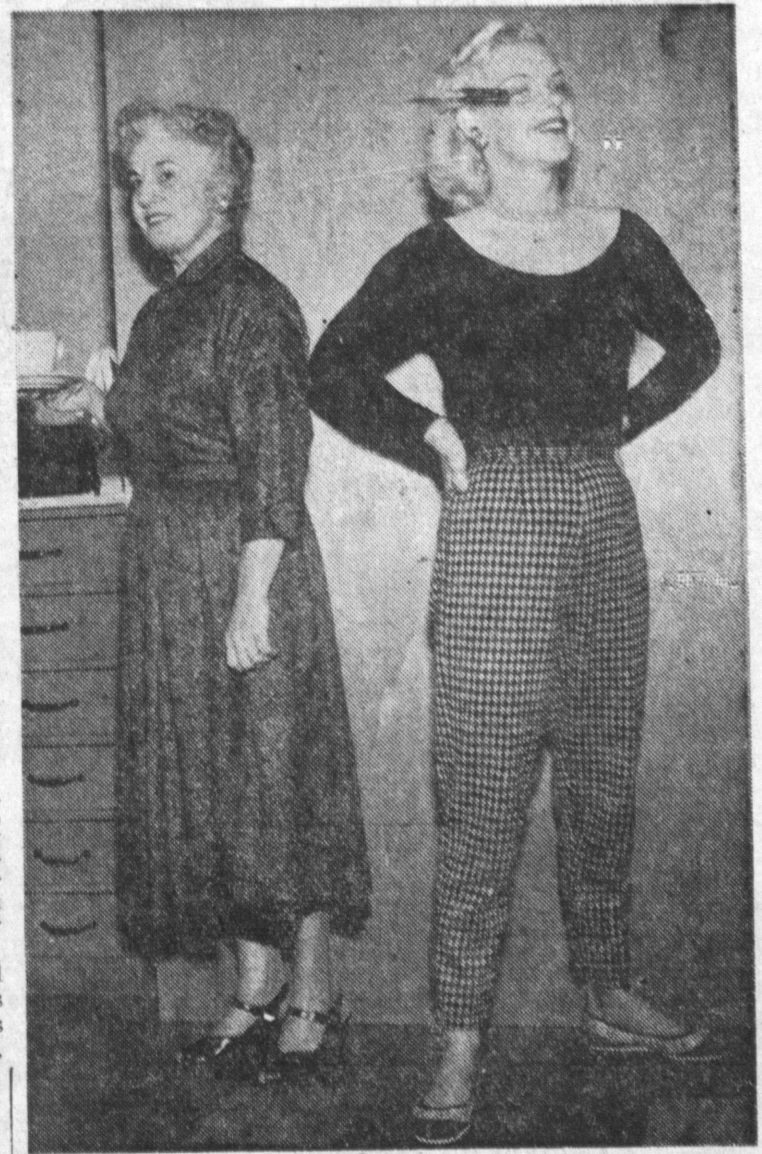
At the roundup, each child will receive a physical examination.
