It was in a Spirit of Revival and Evangelism, that the first Church of the Nazarene was ever started, in the City of Los Angeles, California. It was not the intention of the founder, Dr. P. F. Breese, to start a new denomination when he conducted a revival in a tabernacle, but rather his desire to have "Spiritual Freedom" and to preach the truths of God. But from that group, other groups started and eventually groups from the eastern states had joined in, then from Texas, until in 1908 the Church of the Nazarene was born as a dehomination.

Thus, it is a product of the twentieth century; born to meet today's spiritual needs. It sprung from the prayers and aspirations of ministers and laity who wanted a warm-hearted Church home, where the Bible was taught in it's fullness.

From this humble beginning of a few scattered churches with but a few thousand members the Church has increased in these 50 years until now there are over 300,000 members in the U. S., Canada, and England.

The Church has developed a strong department to care for its foreign Missionary work on 27 fields, where there are close to 40,000 full members.

And this has been the history of the Torrance church, for the Church here was started from a revival and organized as a Church in 1937. The beginnings were small and the struggle hard, but today we have a beautiful Church with equipment and class-rooms for a growing Sunday School.

The first Pastor of the local Church was here for almost fourteen years, and now the present Pastor, Rev. Freeman A. Brunson, has been called to serve his sixth year at the church.

It has been the privilege and pleasure of the Torrance Church to have a large majority of it's congregation and membership made up of teen-agers and young peo-



ple. There is a warmth and fellowship that can never be found in the affairs of society today. Seven young men of the Church are now preparing, or planning to prepare, for the Ministry or to be Missionaries on some foreign field.

Our Church has tried to keep step with the growing City of Torrance so that we may invite you and your friends to worship with us. The Music and Message of the Church is to help and inspire to Christian living. The style of our building, the singing of the choir, and the messages of the Pastor will help you to forget the cares of this life as you wait upon the Lord.
