The door prize will be a five-gallon tank and hood.

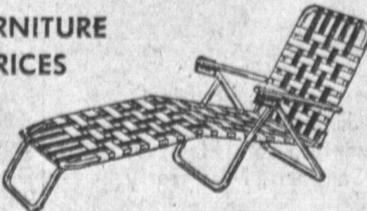

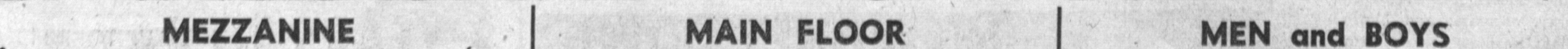
Mr. Leonard Babcock, Associate Guardian Bethel No. 50, gave the Benediction.
