"I will second your motion," Isen said, "although I don't agree with anything you said. The case prevailed in court because of technical discrepancies in our Civil Service ordinances, As a result of firing the two men, our building department was reorganized. The department did a record amount of business which would not have been done otherwise. As a result. we've made the \$15,000 which we now spend many times over."

"I feel somewhat as you do," City Manager George Stevens commented. "There's never been a doubt in my mind that the city did the right thing."

The money represents backpay due the two men from the time they were fired. Dresser will also be rehired, but it was indicated that he will submit his resignation immediately, as part of the condition.


