 Among the questions the group wants answered are: 1) Whether all city offices will be elective (clerk, treasurer, and others); 2) Will councilmen be elected from districts or at large; 3) Will there be limits to the amount of money the council can vote to spend in any one fiscal year; 4) Where is the \$15,000 coming from to cover the expense of incorporation; 5) Will gambling houses be prohibited; 6) Will the complete petition of incorporation be published before it is circulated.

 ruled the commission, 5-0, upon recommendation of City Manager George Stevens and fired the two men.

"Unfortunately I don't know if the city acted in haste or what happened," Councilman Nick Draie commented Tuesday night. "I don't think the city is guilty but we've been informed that we've taken the wrong action."

He indicated that he was in favor of setting the case immediately.

Mayor Albert Isen seconded Draie's motion, which passed 4-0.

Different View
 "I will second your motion," Isen said, "although I don't agree with anything you said. The case prevailed in court because of technical discrepancies in our Civil Service ordinances. As a result of firing the two men, our building department was reorganized. The department did a record amount of business which would not have been done otherwise. As a result, we've made the \$15,000 which we now spend many times over."

"I feel somewhat as you do," City Manager George Stevens commented. "There's never been a doubt in my mind that the city did the right thing."

The money represents back-pay due the two men from the time they were fired. Dresser will also be rehired, but it was indicated that he will submit his resignation immediately, as part of the condition.

Old And New Controversy
 Draie also made a motion to reinstate the Civil Service Commission — which had been stripped of its trial and hearing powers by the council—to full status.

Blount seconded this motion. "You think they are vindicated?" Isen asked. "I don't think so."

Councilman Bob Jahn asked time to consider his attitude in the matter.

"I don't know a thing about this (not having been on the council at the time of the original civil service controversy)," he said.

This matter will be the first order of business when Councilman Draie returns from his vacation in two weeks (August 7).

The controversy hinges on who should have the final word in civil service matters—the Civil Service Board or the City Council.
