that an average of 50 calls are made each day by his department on TV sets alone.

The present Dennee building is an outgrowth of the TV Exposition staged by its founder in 1949 in an old garage. This was followed by Dennee acquiring a furniture store adjacent to the garage, followed by the establishment of a drug store which occupied the corner. Later, three retail stores were acquired at the southern end of the building adjacent to the post office, which was incorporated into one building. At one time, during Dennee's fabulous growth, the firm had seven separate locations in Southern California.

At the time of the exposition, the firm employed eight persons; today, there are 35 employees.
