prior to the birth date. Therefore, for admission purposes, these birth dates extend to children born on the second as well as the first.

Children pre-registering must be accompanied by a parent or guardian. However, for convenience of working parents, children may be registered by an adult so designated by the parent or guardian.

Proof of age is required for admission to either kindergarten or first grade. Acceptable documents are a birth certificate, a duly attested baptismal certificate, passport, health office or vital statistics record of birth date, or an affidavit of parent or guardian.

Children who attended kindergarten last semester but are not yet eligible for admission to the first grade need not be re-registered, since they will automatically be enrolled.

Children transferring to school from a kindergarten in another Los Angeles city school will be assured automatically of enrollment. However, children transferring from a school outside the city system must be processed as if they were entering a kindergarten or first grade for the first time. Although kindergarten wait-


