

The radio broadcast is heard locally every Sunday at 5:30 P.M. over KGER and at 6:30 P.M. over KHJ. The television program is viewed at 3:30 P.M. each Sunday over KRCA, Channel 4.

In keeping with the long recognized importance of Christian training for children in the Lutheran Church, Immanual Lutheran is this fall beginning its Christian Day School. The school will open in September with the first four grades in its present building; and anticipates the addition of further building and the upper grades a year from now.



The Rev. A. L. T. Schuetz, who has been pastor of Immanuel Lutheran since September, 1950, is a graduate of St. John's College in Winfield, Kansas and of Concordia Thelogical Seminary in St. Louis, Mo., in the class of 1941. Prior to coming to Redondo Beach, he served congregations in Wyoming, New Mexico, and Colorado.

Pastor Schuetz also serves as the Thursday morning speaker on the Southern California Lutheran Hour radio program. This program, heard each morning Monday through Friday from 9:00 to 9:30 a.m. over radio station KGER (1390 kc), is sponsored by the Missouri Synod Lutheran Churches of Southern California.

Worship services are held at Immanuel Lutheran each Sunday at 8:30 A.M.
