

This is called the Point of No Return, when the plane reaches the fix on the chart it is not wise to turn back, regardless of the circumstances, for by going on to the original destination the plane is closer to safety. The pilots realize that the normal instinct is to turn back regardless of the distance traveled, so they put the fix on the map to reassure them that it will be far better to continue on.

Each of us reach the Point of No Return in our Christian experience, we are faced with trials, problems, temptations, or sorrows, and in our human way of reasoning we say to ourselves, "Perhaps we should turn back, or perhaps it isn't worth the effort to go on." But, there is a place where you cannot turn back without losing

when we have an understanding of the scriptures that will guide our lives. When the Lord has witnessed to our hearts showing us that we need to turn our hearts and lives over to Him. When we are aware that there is something lacking in our lives, because the happiness, the joy, the peace is missing. When we know that by turning away from God we die spiritually.

The Bible tells us that, "All have sinned and come short of the glory of God." That Jesus Christ died on the cross at

Calvary for our sins and we are going to have to do something about it.

That we must repent and be baptized for the remission of our sins.

The Bible causes us to realize that sooner or later we are going to have to do something about what we do understand. For

Rev. Clifford L. Tierney you and I this is the Point of No Return. Someone once said, "It is not the things that I do not understand that bother me, but rather, the things that I do understand." This is true because we are held accountable unto God for what we do understand.

A friend of mine had a dog that loved to chase a certain cat. Each time this cat sauntered by, the dog would dash off of the porch and chase the cat as if catching the cat were the most important goal in his life - as long as the cat kept running everything was fine, but sometimes the cat would stop, arch it's back and prepare to defend itself, when this happened the dog would fall all over himself trying to stop before he reached the cat, then smile apologetically in his doggy fashion and nonchalantly stroll away.

I have seen this type of scene reinacted many times by human beings-they

act very interested in the teachings of the church, they understand many of the scriptures and know that the scriptures apply to their life — they begin to see that they are not serving Jesus Christ, that they are not Christians, that they must be converted by accepting Jesus Christ as their Savior, so they slam on their spiritual brakes, smile sort of sickly and turn away from the Lord. So then, the Point of No Return for you is the scope of your understanding, you cannot turn back on God and live.

We feel that our church is a place where you can attend and experience a relationship with God that will continue throughout all eternity. We teach that all persons who have accepted Jesus Christ as their personal Savior are members of the same church, the spiritual church of God. Acts 2:47 reads, ". . . and the Lord added to the church daily such as should be saved." We hold that the church is essentially one; that it is not an organization, but a spiritual organism, made up of all true Christians everywhere. But we realize that no present day group or organization could properly claim to include all of God's people. But the church, in the New Testament sense of the term, does include all true Christians.

Holding, as we do, this view of the church, we do not ask people to "join" our church, nor do we "take in" members, as is common in other Christian bodies.

Our concern is to lead people to accept Christ and yield their lives to Him. When this is done by any person, we believe the Lord adds that one to the church that Jesus built, and his name is written in heaven.

We are ready to fellowship all true Christians without raising any barrier of denominational name, creed or procedure.

We are definitely opposed to anything and everything that tends in any way to separate God's people into competitive groups.
