

# ATTEND THE CHURCH OF YOUR FAITH

"Jesus said unto him, thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind." This is the first and great commandment. (Matt. 22:37-38.) How many of us who call ourselves Christians can truly say we are keeping the commandment which the Lord tells us is the most important one?

Can you truthfully say you love God? It is obvious that the keeping of all other commandments hinges upon this one. In speaking to Peter, for example, the Lord said, "If you love me keep my commandments."

How can we teach our children to be reverent, law abiding, respectful, if we do not first teach them to love the Lord. Reverence for sacred things is akin to the respect for law.

It has been truly said that reverence is the noblest state in which a man can live in the world. If that is true, then irreverent man has a crudeness about him that is repellant. He is cynical, often sneering, and

nearly always iconoclastic. Reverence and obedience to law should begin at home. Indeed, too much emphasis cannot be laid upon the responsibility of rents to teach their children reverence for God in all things sacred, and to honor and uphold the law.

J. Edgar Hoover recently presented some statistics showing that for every dollar given to the churches in the United State last year, crime cost fourteen dollars. For every dollar going into education in America, crime cost \$1.46. This points up one of the major problems in our country. As usual, Mr. Hoover also presented some fine suggestions

for remedying the situation. They are:
1. "Until youth learns to respect and obey the teachings of Almighty God, we can never expect them to obey civil law or the laws of society."

BISHOP STEELE 2. "I suggest that this alarming condition (high percentage of crime being committed by juveniles) would be quickly remedied if parents were held legally and financially responsible for the criminal acts of their children." Youth needs to know, love and obey God.

Parents must rear their children properly. Both relate to the home. If parents don't honor and obey God, how can they expect their children to do so?

There is no value in godlessness. Parents must realize that, and they must do something about it, more than just talk. A proper regard for religion would solve the entire problem, because as people love the Lord they will love their fellow men, and as they serve God, they will honor the rights and privileges of their fellow men. There is something about being irreligious which invites difficulty. It promotes

disregard for law and order, and for the rights and privileges of others. Persons who



are without faith in God are usually without the restraints which keep them from

what we ordinarily regard as sin.

But where true faith is, there is to be found good character, good citizenship, good people. It is time that we turn the tide, and reverse the ratio of crime to religion. There is no place in America for a situation in which crime gets 14 times the emphasis given to religion.
