They accept their responsibilities. They shape their chvironment whenever possible;

they adjust to it whenever necessary. They plan ahead but do not fear the future. They welcome new experiences and new ideas. They make use of their natural capacities. They set realistic goals for themselves. They are able to think for themselves and make

their own decisions. They put their best effort into what they do, and get satisfaction out of doing it.

Despite these guide lines, which, basically, are as old as man himself, society has always had to cope with the problem of mental illness - often in a sorry and sordid way.

However, we are beginning to assume a more constructive, a more enlightened, and a more sympathetic attitude toward mental illness, Dr. Conrad indicated.

"While we will not be able to eliminate mental illness," he concluded, "our hope is to reduce its extent and its severity."
