Exceptional Company spokesmen said that he was exceptional, and that for all practical purposes he was considered by his co-workers as a full engineer, even though he had not yet completed his formal studies.

Herder had been sent back east to visit electron tube manufacturers for his company regarding important work on the snark guided missile program.

He contracted polio a week ago Monday, the day before he was scheduled to return home. He was rushed to a hospital in Louisville, Kentucky where he was placed in an iron lung.

Herder died Monday, one day after his 29th birthday.

He is survived by his father and mother; wife; children; and a sister, Mrs. J. W. Cambren, Jr. of Lyndon, Kentucky.

Funeral will be held today, Thursday, at 2 p.m. at the Pierce Brothers mortuary, 4601 Crenshaw blvd. Burial will be at Valhalla cemetery, Burbank, Rev. Thomas J. Gibbs of the Westchester Christian church, officiating.
