Your children need the three 'R's'. It is of vital importance in this day as more and more demands are made upon the individual use of mental facilities. But your children will badly need the fourth 'R' at a time when they will no longer need

In preparing for confirmation, children from the 7th and 8th grades are invited to attend Saturday morning instruction classes.

Property adjoining the church is awaiting construction of a Christian Day School. It will be the intention of this future school to provide adequate facilities for training children in all FOUR 'R's' in a Christian atmosphere.

With these organizations and our regular worship services, we invite parents and childern to learn of God, and His Word, and to prepare for eternal life with Him. We, also invite you to listen to the International "Lutheran Hour" each week, and to watch the Christ centered TV program, "This is the Life," both sponsored by the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod and its 2,000,000 members.
