His affliction is the strange and incurable malady of the blood called hemophilia, which means that the clotting factor is almost non-existent. Thus, he has learned to avoid the overly-active life that brings on bumps, bruises and cuts,-any of which can result in a prolonged and possibly fatal bleeding seizure.

Fortunately, there is a special ly processed blood derivative called anti-hemophilia plasma. Because of this substance—the only one known which will stop a hemophiliac from bleeding to death-Richard's worries are considerably lessoned.

Though there are worse hemophilia cases, Richard has need for the plasma at least three or four times a year, reports his mother, who went on to explain that all bleeding seizures occur without warning, and cannot always be attributed to any specific cause. "That is why it is important
