

Church Chest Volunteers See Films

More than 40 volunteer workers for the Community Chest residential solicitation, scheduled November 8, convened at St. Catharine Labouré Catholic church in Torrance for a briefing session.

Volunteers from two adjoining parishes, St. Anthony's in Gardena, and St. Catharine Labouré, were briefed on solicitation procedure and contents of working kits. Two Chest films, "These Hands Are Yours," depicting actual scenes from Red Feather welfare services, and "The Big Yes," telling the campaign story, were shown.

Mmes. Kenneth Murphy and Ada Knutson are serving as co-chairmen for the two parishes during the residential solicitation.

Father Martin Slought, assistant director of the Catholic Welfare Bureau, stressed the four point program for support of the Chest campaign, namely: one campaign for 168 welfare services; low fund raising costs; Chest gifts efficiently spent, and gifts allocated according to need of participating agencies.

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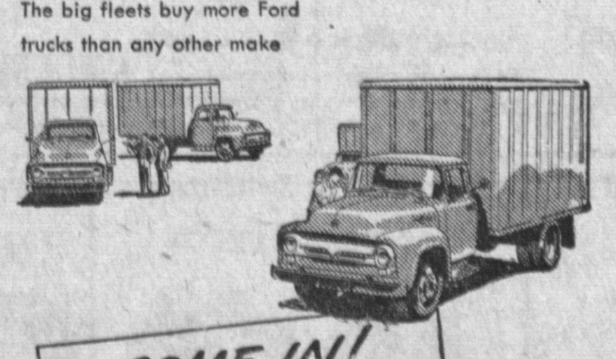
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
